PARISH FOOTPATH WARDEN

In June, a number of villagers turned out for another community guided walk. On a beautifully sunny day the

footpaths took us across some of the fields to the north of Syresham – and about 9 stiles. It was scorchingly hot (mad dogs and Englishmen!) so the refreshments at the end were very well received, along with a hearty ploughman's lunch.

Another walk is planned for the Autumn; it will be cooler and possibly damp so we will be revived afterwards with some homemade soup. Look out for details nearer the time. As well as


exploring some of our local rights of way, these walks are also a great way to meet new people.

But don't wait till then, get out there now! A useful interactive map to help plan your walks can be found at https://bit.ly/42E284u. This online map allows the user to select a layer that indicates all the public rights of way across the parish, along with their reference numbers. Having a map on your phone, or a printed copy in your pocket, will help you keep to the footpath, bridleway or byway.

Anyone experiencing difficulties using our local rights of way (e.g. damaged stiles/gates/footbridges, overgrown/impassable paths etc) is encouraged to report issues directly via www.fixmystreet.com when you get home.

On the 'report your problem' page, select the 'right of way' category for issues with footpaths, bridleways and byways etc. The report goes directly to the relevant local authority and their contractors.

You can even submit a report via your mobile phone while you're actually out



on location. It uses GPS to pinpoint the very spot (rather than having to search on an online map when you get home) and you can take/upload pictures from wherever you are.

Users of rights of way around the parish have been quite active in submitting reports in this way; it seems a very simple and efficient way to log any problems encountered. If the Parish Path Warden is also notified, then progress can be monitored, and any outstanding matters followed up.

HS2 PROGRESS AND A43 ROAD CLOSURES

Preparations for the realignment of A43 to provide space for on-going development work between Brackley BP roundabout and B4525 Syresham turn is now imminent.

THE A43 NORTHBOUND will be fully closed overnight, from the Brackley BP roundabout to the Syresham Junction, Mon-Fri from 8pm to 6am, on the following dates:

- Monday 7 August to Saturday 12 August
- Wednesday 6 September to Wednesday 27 September.

The **A43 SOUTHBOUND** will be fully closed overnight, from the Syresham Junction to the Brackley BP roundabout, Mon-Fri from 8pm to 6am, on the following dates:

- ♦ Monday 14 August to Wednesday 6 September.
- ♦ Closures will not take place on

Friday 25 August and Monday 28 August over the bank holiday weekend.

WHAT TO EXPECT Overnight full road closures of the A43. Speed restrictions on this section of the A43. These dates may be subject to change due to circumstances outside of our control, such as weather. These works are subject to consents.

HS2 NOTIFICATION: Notice of road closure: **SULGRAVE ROAD** and the opening of the GREATWORTH **TEMPORARY ROAD.** From autumn 2023 we will be opening a new temporary road, known as the 'Greatworth T'. This road will keep traffic flowing to villages north of Greatworth, while we build the Greatworth Green Tunnel. A section of Sulgrave Road will be closed from 31 July to 31 August 2023, 24-hours a day. A diversion will be in place. There will be traffic lights on B4525, Welsh Lane from 14 to 23 August 2023.

WASTE DISPOSAL AND RECYCLING

Stickers promoting the correct use of



waste and recycling bins have been distributed to households across West Northamptonshire. The stickers support three campaigns which aim to raise awareness of what people can and can't put into their collections, in a bid to reduce household contamination in collections, improve the quality of our recycling and maintain the safety of crews and residents by ensuring batteries are disposed of correctly.

The stickers are placed on top of general waste bins, with clear instructions on what cannot go into the black bin:

- * No Batteries, use separate collection
- * No Food Waste, use your food caddy
- * No Recyclables, use your recycling bin. **EDITOR**

This year is a major year of change within the ranks of Take Your SEAT





The Climate Change Committee also arranged for members of the Wildlife Trust to come to the village to look at our verges and to give us advice on rewilding. A copy of their interesting report can be found on the Parish Council website.

The Parish Council have also met with Pathfinder 3, a WNC group that aims to facilitate resilience and preparedness among communities that are at risk of surface water flooding in Northamptonshire. We have secured a grant from them which we hope will help to lessen the problem of lying water and accumulation of soil and debris on the pavement outside the Swingfield.

You may have noticed that the sign in

the Swingfield is missing! Fear not. The parish Council has commissioned a new sign that will soon be erected. There will also be a sign near the memorial stone in Abbey Road asking people to refrain from parking on the grass near the stone as a sign of respect.

Our newly appointed Police Liaison representative arranged for the police fraud officer to visit the Coffee Shop to talk informally to residents about the problems of fraud and how to recognise and avoid it. The officer will also soon be giving talks on this subject to the Friendship Club and to GEMS.

West Northants Council is presently carrying out a Resources and Waste Consultation which ends on 21st August. The Parish Council urges residents to fill in a questionnaire that will help to shape the Resources and Waste strategy for all of us who use their waste collection services. Please contact
