Twyford to Greatworth (T2G) Project at a glance













What is a Mobile Visitor Centre and how will it benefit communities?


- The Mobile Visitor Centre is essentially a touring information centre that gives us flexibility to visit villages, towns, community spaces or local events, to share updates on our construction works and answer questions from the public
- The MVC will feature fixed informative displays on HS2 and EKFB, as well as two large interactive digital screens featuring mapping software, videos and photo galleries. We will also have copies of recent notifications and fact sheets
- We encourage residents to come along and ask us questions about the project and what works we have coming up in the area, and we hope that they will find it informative and helpful



A43 Overbridge

- 65.8m in length
- 34.1m wide and up to;
- 8.6m above track level
- The overbridge will comprise of a dual carriageway road comprising of two carriageways, hard strips, and asphalt verges.
- The A43 Overbridge has been designed to allow for the future provision of a cycleway should the highway authority National Highways upgrade the cycling provision along the entirety of the A43 in the future.



A422 Overbridge


- 124m in length

- 26m above track level
- The overbridge will comprise of a single carriageway road that will be 6m wide

 - Working on the abutments and wingwalls of the bridge.
 - 4-6 weeks
 - Beam installation summer 2024
- Bulk excavation Continues
- In June there will be a 2week road closure to move the plant crossing.






Brackley Food Bank
