Maybe, though, this survival of the ancient Lenten Fast in our day indicates that a lot of people

> don't think an unrestrained pursuit of what they as individuals might want is always appropriate; perhaps there's an acknowledgement here of the need for self-discipline and self-denial.

Resolving to give something up in Lent (it doesn't have to

be much) and sticking with that decision is to stand against the 'me' culture. It's to recognise that 'me and what I want' isn't the best guide to living well and it's to train oneself a little in the self-restraint necessary to honour the principle of loving our neighbours as ourselves. So do think of giving something up over Lent; as so often when doing something not directed to your own immediate gratification, you will, nevertheless, feel the better for it!

### PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

First of all the Parish Council would like to wish all residents a belated but



### heartfelt

'Happy and Healthy New Year'.

We were very pleased in November to

welcome our new Parish Clerk, Nichola Ali who has been busy preparing the budget and precept application for the forthcoming year that was required to be submitted by January. This was by no means an easy initial task for a clerk to carry out, but Nichola has coped extremely well and we thank her for her hard work and diligence. We also have a vacancy for a Parish Councillor. If you feel that serving your community in this way is something you would like to do, please contact the Clerk for more details.

West Northants Council are asking for your comments on a plan that affects our village, namely the Local Cycling Walking and Infrastructure Plan (LCWIP). These plans are open for consultation until 15<sup>th</sup> February and aim to create a culture of walking and cycling by proposing infrastructure developments that make active travel a natural choice for residents and visitors. Three sections of the plan affect our parish, namely the routes from Brackley to Syresham, Syresham to Silverstone and from Syresham to Crowfield. The plans are in the very early stages but the Parish Council feels it is vitally important that there should be a safe and permanently useable route that connects the part of our parish that is presently only permanently and safely accessible by car, namely Crowfield. It has been suggested that we ask for this part of the route, Syresham to Crowfield, to be completed first as a showcase to what the other routes will look like. If you would like to see this happen, please make sure you go online and have your say. You are of course also most welcome to comment on the whole plan - you can contact LocalTransportPlan@westnorthants.g ov.uk and complete the online survey.

There is finally an update on the Truckstop planning application. The Highways and Flood Risk reports have been submitted to WNC and it is envisaged that the earliest the application will go before the planning committee is late March or early April. More details can be seen on the WNC portal.

West Northants is now in the process of implementing its Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPO) that is intended to promote responsible dog ownership and also prohibits smoking (including vaping) in certain public places across the whole of West Northamptonshire. You may have noticed that notices have been put up by WNC next to the Swingfield gate. This means that it is now an offence to smoke or vape within the play area. The penalty for not adhering to this ruling is a fine of £100.

The Parish Council will be organising the Annual Litterpick during the week commencing 8<sup>th</sup> April. This initiative is now supported by our local MP, Andrea Leadsom who came out to Syresham last year to help. We hope she will take part again this year and we hope that as many residents as possible will also take part to ensure we have a litter free and tidy village that we can all be proud of..

Finally, please look out for the new bench that the Parish Council has purchased to replace the one that was destroyed some years ago by a falling branch at the top of the High Street. The bench is made of recycled material in accordance with our Climate Change Action Plan and was purchased as a result of money awarded to the village in the last Village of the Year competition.

If you have any concerns you would like the Parish Council to discuss, please contact the Parish Clerk. Please note that Potholes or Highway problems can be reported directly to the West Northants 'Street Doctor' or 'Fix My Street' on the West Northants Council website. The more people who report problems to West Northants, the quicker they will be investigated. So please don't hesitate to report such problems.

BRACKLEY LOCAL CYCLING AND WALKING INFRASTRUCTURE PLAN

The Brackley Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan

(BLCWIP) proposes to make it safer and easier for people to walk, wheel, or cycle in and around Brackley and connect with local villages.

The draft plan is now at the stage where West Northants Council are seeking views from both stakeholders and members of the public to enable the plan to be finalised.

We would appreciate it if you are able to circulate this widely to colleagues and members of the local community to ensure the maximum number of people have a chance to have their say on the proposals.

The consultation will remain open until **MIDNIGHT ON SUNDAY 25**<sup>TH</sup> **FEBRUARY**, following which there will be a review of the feedback and use it to finalise the document before it is taken to Cabinet for a decision on adopting the document by the Council.

### JOHN MICHAEL NASH

John was born in 1936 and grew up in Bromley. After a short spell as a runner with Lloyds Bank in the City,



he was called up for National Service in 1954 and joined the Royal Air Force. Whilst posted to Northern Ireland, he met Dilys and married in February 1957 and had two children, Julie and Peter.

John trained as a Navigator, and flew in Coastal Command, being stationed mostly at RAF Kinloss in Scotland and St Mawgan in Cornwall. He first flew in Shackletons, then was part of the aircrew that flew the first Nimrod into service at RAF St Mawgan, in which he continued to fly and train others throughout the 1970s. He often flew overseas, and he and Mum had tours in Gibraltar and Germany, as well as a tour as RAF Liaison Officer with the Royal Navy in Portland.

John took early retirement from the RAF in 1986 and he and Dilys moved to the village of Wombourne, near Wolverhampton, where he worked as Partnership Secretary for a firm of solicitors. Dilys passed away in 1988.

Then, when Julie and her husband Allen were selling their cottage in Bell Lane, Syresham in 2003, John jumped t the chance to buy it from them. He absolutely loved living in Syresham, joining every committee going in the village, including the Village Hall Committee, the History Society and the Parish Council. He enjoyed organizing things and got up to great larks with Dot and Chris and many other members of the committees.

As a great DIY enthusiast, John spent a lot of time working on his cottage and in his garden, digging and planting and pottering around with the ponds and the wood store. His DIY skills were put to good use when he and Rob Dixon rebuilt the Old Village Hall kitchen. He had a couple of garages in The Pound in which he stored a number of things. including it would appear some council road signs - Road Closed", "Diversion" and a number of traffic cones - all for use during village events! He helped to organise the War Memorial stone opposite the pub. He was instrumental in the flood relief process for the village, and even bought a pair of waders so he could unblock the drains down by the river Great Ouse. He was for a time the bookings clerk for the old Village Hall, as well as countless other activities in the village.

John enjoyed cooking, a skill put to good use when he baked pissaladière and scones for the Syresham coffee shop. Apparently his scones were more like rock cakes but Nigel enjoyed them!

John never wanted to move from Syresham, and we were so pleased that he was able to live in his cottage until the end, sitting in his chair looking out into the garden he so loved, often saying, "That grass needs cutting", and then looking pointedly at whomever happened to be in the kitchen with him.

John has been described as a real gentleman, a true friend, always good humoured and good fun, and one of the nicest men you could ever wish to meet. He had a loving family in Julie and Allen, Pete, John's grandson Tom, and Tom's mum Clare. He had a group of wonderful friends both from his time in the Royal Air Force and those he met here in Syresham.

A huge thank you from John's family to all of you who were so kind and helpful and good fun throughout John's time in Syresham, and who quietly kept an eye on him in his final years. He is greatly missed.

Trustees of Brackley Community Hospital 2020 Trust, using funds raised by the local community, were extremely pleased to have recently presented the Brackley Community Hospital with much needed patient transport. The charity was asked to consider funding a wheel-chair accessible vehicle, that could be used to benefit the patients in the intermediate care beds on the second floor of Brackley Community Hospital.

Transport is often required to assist patients attending hospital for appointments off-site. also specialised treatments and assessments prior to discharge. Until now local taxi firms have been used. but are not always ideal as they are expensive and time limited due to school contracts.



Once we had confirmation of the ongoing expenses of such a project (annual servicing and checks), a suitable vehicle was sourced in good working condition and with low mileage, just the other side of Northampton.

The vehicle was personalised for us, and although donated by the charity,

it has been funded by donations from Brackley and surrounding communities.


Sadly Ed's health deteriorated these last few years and recently had him confined to bed, being very weak.

### SYRESHAM CE SCHOOL TREE PLANTING AT BRADBERY CLOSE

On Monday 5th February, members of Syresham School gathered with people from the village at the corner of Bradbery Close. We were joined by two members from the Stowe Gardens National Trust to plant a Braeburn apple tree as part of The Blossom project, which is a national project. These are useful if you need to report any damaged stiles/bridges. missing waymarking signs, or blocked public rights of way to http:// www.fixmystreet.com. undertaken by the relevant authorities and landowners over the past few months.


