Long grass and wildflowers benefit wildlife, tackle pollution and can even lock away carbon below ground. We've lost nearly 97% of flower rich meadows since the 1970's and with them gone so is the vital food needed by pollinators, like bees and butterflies.

Even the smallest grassy patches add up to a significant proportion of our land that have the potential to deliver enormous gains for nature, communities and the climate. This is why Plantlife is calling for people to get involved with #NoMowMay and let wild plants get a head start on the summer.

THE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

The annual village meeting often causes confusion in many parishes. A resident has come to the Clerk to ask what the Annual Parish Meeting is and how it differs from the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council. So by way of explanation:

- the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council is a Parish Council meeting and must take place on any day in May, except in an election year when it must take place on the day the Councillors take office or within 14 days thereafter.
- The Annual Parish Meeting <u>is not a</u> <u>Parish Council meeting</u> and must take place between 1st March and 1st June.

The meetings are separate, even though the Parish Council Chairman

must preside if present and the council helps to make the arrangements. However, it is a residents' and local organisations' meeting and residents and local organisations can request items for the agenda or suggest guest speakers. The date is set in January and planning for speakers starts soon after. There are no rules as to which meeting comes first and this has been decided previously based on availability of a suitable venue and whether or not it is an election year. However, traditionally in Syresham and in many other local parishes, both have been held in May to allow time for local organisations to have their AGMs and prepare their annual accounts and reports (including the

VILLAGE IDIOT

I thoroughly enjoyed my visit to the Royal Stratford East Theatre to



watch Samson Hawkins play, *VILLAGE IDIOT*. It was an added pleasure to meet Colin and Sally Hollyoake and family before the play (ok, we were all in the bar!) also Barbara Hawkins and family after the play. The play treats some very important current issues in a refreshingly open minded way and very cleverly places those issues in the context of Syresham life. While the Syresham context is important for all of us who live or have lived here, the play also works well for those with no connection to the village.

Village idiot draws upon much that people in Syresham will be familiar with. Take Your Seat, the local talent show, the sports club's Friday night meat raffle (two cans of Strongbow cider really is the vegetarian option), the Syresham song and the annual vegetable competition all feature. Of course the main Syresham reference point is fencing. Not offencing, there is none of that and not Olympic fencing, regrettably. All serve to provoke thought about serious issues. Disability, race, sexuality and most prominently the impact that our species is having upon the planet. All are sensitively examined and examined with humour and robust language rather than in a stuffy academic manner. The negative effect that HS2 has on Syresham is exaggerated but it does serve as a good vehicle to discuss the impact that we all have on our environment. The point that we cannot forever defy the natural world is forcefully made and the conclusion that we must work

with nature is cleverly made. HS2 and the controversy around its construction is a good vehicle for this point. Sam's play makes it clear that whatever our differences on other issues, we should be able to come together on this one. It will need more than using our blue bins and installing a smart meter though.

Action at all levels of government is required. Abolishing the laws put in place to protect our environment when we were in the EU, as is currently being proposed, may not be the best way forward. Who is the village idiot? In my opinion it is anyone who ignores the main issue that Sam raises in this play.

Before I saw the play I was told by many people that it contains a lot of swearing. Indeed, when the actors



introduce the performance this is emphasised. "A lot of people say that it's a lack of vocabulary that makes you swear. Rubbish. I know thousands of words but I still prefer 'fuck'", Billy Connolly.

I don't know if Sam shares my enthusiasm for Billy Connolly but his script suggests that he might. To



anyone who finds frequent use of swear words offensive but is not offended by our assault on the natural world I would suggest that your offence meter needs recalibrating.

By the time that you read this, I suspect that it will be too late to book tickets for Stratford East but keep an eye on theatre listings in case it appears elsewhere. For my part, I am looking forward to Sam's next play.

can ask the trustees to draw down a further £20,000, we have £5000 to use in our bank account and I am asking the Friends of the Church if we could use the 200-club money for the steeple this year. We can get half way there. After that you may find me out and about with my metaphorical begging bowl applying to charities and anyone willing to save our steeple. All help welcomed however small.

In February, in addition to our own meeting which was a film presentation, we also joined the History Society for a very interesting talk on the gardens of Canons Ashby by Laura Malpas.



PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

The Parish Council has continued its work on behalf of all the



residents of Syresham, Crowfield and Pimlico and other local residents. The issue of Climate Change looms large on the horizon and is an issue that the Parish Council takes very seriously. With that in mind, the Council decided at their meeting of Wednesday 29th March to declare a Climate Emergency. The act of declaring a Climate Emergency shows that Svresham Parish Council acknowledges that such an emergency exists and the Council must now set its priorities to address climate change activities in our local area. The Climate Change and Environment Committee (CCEC) will now be responsible for the preparation of an action plan and council policies relating to this issue and all their meeting minutes will be available view to on www.syreshamvillage.com

The Council has decided to take part in the 'No Mow May' INITIATIVE. Details of this can be found in this edition of the Syresham Times and on Facebook and the Parish Council website. Please think seriously about joining in our attempt to save our pollinators. You will also have noticed that a section of the bank in the Swingfield has been cleared of grass and is being prepared as a small wildflower meadow to be planted with wildflower seeds by the children of our school. Hopefully we will have a colourful display later on in the year. This may seem a simple activity, but wildflower meadows do require a

certain amount of work and attention in order to be successful. This is our trial, and we will see how it goes.

The annual Village Litterpick took place at the end of March. The council is very grateful to the volunteers who took part and also to the schoolchildren and brownies who collected litter around the village. We were very pleased that Dame Andrea Leadsom M.P. also joined us on the Saturday, sporting her own hi-viz jacket and litterpicking equipment. This is one of the issues of particular interest to her, and she was very keen to help.

The Parish Council is looking to replace play equipment for the rather tired looking 'house' in the Swingfield. We are also aware that there is a need to provide facilities for children 11 plus and teenagers. The Council would like to hear from our young residents to find out what facilities they would like in the village. 


