# BRACKLEY COMMUNITY HOSPITAL

The following is an update from Caryl Billingham MBE, chairman of the recently registered Brackley Community Hospital 2020 Trust; this charity will manage all publicly raised funds and consider applications for capital grants from service providers within the new building.

"First of all, may I express my gratitude to the people of Syresham who supported the coffee morning in the Village Hall at the end of September. It was good to meet so many of you and to learn of your interest in the new building. Thank you for the handsome donation of £315 that I received at the end of the morning. That represented a truly magnificent return for my two hours in attendance!!!!

The current target is £165,000 which will fund a state-of-the-art digital Xray machine. Once we have crossed that off our wish list, we can start to aim for a scanner, for airlines, for equipment that will enable ophthalmological examinations and treatments within the building. These facilities will not only benefit all the residents of the Brackley GP surgeries who currently travel to Oxford, Northampton, Milton Keynes, and Banbury for their appointments. It will also help our carbon footprint.

The charity is in the process of opening its own bank account; this is the last piece of the jigsaw. For the time being, any monies raised are

being kept safely in the account of the Brackley Hospital Trust, but separately accounted for.

I have been fortunate enough to pay an impromptu visit to the new building and it is much larger than I had expected. Work continues apace with the intention that winter weather should not cause any delays because the walls and roof will be completed before that hits. Update on the building is as follows:

- The building is now surrounded by scaffolding and this will provide safe access for the installation of the external walls, window casements and frames.
- The work on the car park has started, particularly the area closer to the building. Over the next few months more and more vehicles will require access, and, rather than have the ground churned up, it will enable the vehicles to travel on a solid platform.
- A levelling process is almost complete to the left and rear of the building. This gives the opportunity for a level pathway around the building, and it will eliminate the steep incline that was present before.
- The roof is 80% complete and should be finished shortly.

The room partitions have been installed on the top floor and clearly show the outline of the bedrooms including the ensuite bathrooms. This work is on-going and moving through the first and ground floor over the next few weeks.

Completion of the building remains ontarget for May 2020 and it is anticipated that fitting out should take no more than four to six weeks, so it should be operational by July/August next year. Exciting times! At last."

# PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

The Parish Council are very pleased to report that new play equipment



will be installed in the Swingfield within a matter of weeks. Residents may recall that the wooden equipment has shown signs of rotting at ground level for some months and this has been monitored very closely by Councillors. At the most

recent inspection one item of equipment was deemed unsafe and removed immediately. The other items are still safe to use, but most will



be replaced when the upgrade of the Swingfield takes place. We very much hope that the children will enjoy using the new equipment. This, however, is only the first stage of the project and hopefully we will have more news of the second stage in the next edition of the Syresham Times.

The Parish Council's second major project, namely the replacement and upgrading of the street lights, also continues apace. Much work has been done on this during the past three months and it is hoped that we will also



be able to report on the timescale for installation in the near future.

Meanwhile, throughout the village, work is being

carried out by Gigaclear to bring the opportunity for every resident to benefit from ultra-fast broadband if they so wish. This is a government initiative and the Parish Council were

given no say in how and when the work should begin and proceed. However, when the work commenced in Abbey Road we were very concerned that residents were not being given sufficient information on how they would be affected.

The Parish Council therefore arranged for representatives from Gigaclear to hold an open evening in the village hall so that they could answer residents' queries on an individual basis and provide more information on the work schedule. We hope that people found this useful. More details regarding the schedule of work, including road closures, are shown below and can also be viewed on the village website and the Parish Council notice board.

We are also very pleased to report that the Probation Services Community Payback Scheme seems to be working very successfully and much clearing work has been done on the cutting back of grass and foliage on the pavement approaching the Welsh Lane.

The white gates at the entrance to the village have also been given a new coat of paint as part of this scheme – we hope everyone has noticed!

The Parish Council has also been working on the issue of the state of our roads. Letters have been sent to Andrea Leadsom, our M.P., Cllr Ian Morris, NCC Highways and the Chief **Executive of Northamptonshire County** Council. We now have Mark Morrell (AKA Mr Pothole) personally pursuing our case. As a result of this, Highways have acknowledged that the village of Syresham is high priority and we are awaiting news on a request to central government for more funding. Please watch this space! In the meantime we would once again remind residents that if they wish to report problems with potholes in the road, uneven pavements etc. You can go online at

www.fixmystreet.northamptonshire.g ov.uk - The more people who report a problem, the more likely it will be dealt with in a timely manner.

Finally, Parish Councillors will meet, as they do every year, at the War Memorial stone in Abbey Road for a brief moment of remembrance and two minutes silence at **11.00 A.M. ON MONDAY 11<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER**.

# ST JAMES INTERREGNUM Update

Syresham Parish has increased its giving and projected giving for 2020 by some £5,000 per

annum, which, after Gift Aid, will be worth over £6000.

This is a fantastic achievement for our village and, matched by similar increases from most other parishes in our Benefice (Radstone, Whitfield, Helmdon. Lois Weedon and Wappenham) meant that our representatives could go to their meeting with the Archdeacon, saying that they had raised enough for a 5-day priest (with two days off). However to their delight the archdeacon was so impressed with our efforts that he is going to recommend to the Bishop that we advertise in December for a full time priest.

This is great news, as it means that we may get a young minister with family (such as has recently been appointed for Brackley).

We are very grateful to all the people of Syresham who have increased or started new giving, and pleased that it has had such a positive effect. In the meantime we have been grateful for the support with services given by John and Will, former Rectors of this benefice, visiting retired priests and Wiggy and Alice for lay led services.

We still need to raise funds to cover running costs and we are putting on another *ARMISTICE EVE CONCERT AT ST JAMES AT 7.30 ON SATURDAY 9<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER.* This features the Brackley


Wind Ensemble and will consist of music and readings with an Armistice theme.

# MPILO HOSPITAL, ZIMBABWE

We have recently returned from our volunteering trip to Mpilo Maternity hospital in Bulawayo, Zimbabwe and would like to thank everyone who supported us to send much needed medical supplies and equipment to this valuable project. We had an amazing time, meeting many incredible Zimbabwean people.

We managed to achieve our goal of decorating and upgrading the antenatal ward, kitchen and midwives' station. We were also able to provide specific training on neonatal resuscitation and on managing postpartum haemorrhage, giving the staff the skills to save lives.

We funded packs for some triplets whose mother died in childbirth and have pledged on-going support. We donated a sewing machine to a local lady who is making privacy curtains for the ward. This has also enabled her to start her own business, making school uniforms thereby helping to lift her and her family out of poverty.

We also helped provide soap to all wash areas, cleaning equipment and products for the cleaners to ensure hygiene standards are met and to reduce the risk of sepsis.

We are planning to present a slide show in the village hall (date to be arranged), showing what we have achieved with your donations. Please keep an eye out for posters advertising




