

The impact on the economy and the health of many thousands is extremely serious. Do many of them have only themselves to blame for ignoring the restrictions? Meantime people are losing relatives and jobs, and many families are struggling.

It feels like we are sleep walking, our feet barely lifting from the ground, and minimal progress is being made.

This crisis is unlike anything we've experienced before. One of the scariest things is the uncertainty. Even as we move out of lockdown, we're still not sure exactly what happens next. Human beings hate uncertainty and want guaranteed answers. Whichever way we turn, as in a maze, the way out remains concealed.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Parish Council would like to express their gratitude to the



local businesses and services that have continued to operate during the last nine months and enabled us to overcome what has been a difficult time in all our lives.

Unfortunately we are not out of the woods yet, but we thank you for all you have done for the community so far.

The Parish Council too has continued to function as near normally as possible and we are very pleased with what we have been able to achieve during the course of this year. The Swingfield project has been completed and we are now working towards the realisation of our second major project which is the replacement of all the village's street lighting with new, more efficient LED lamps. In order to achieve this, we are in the process of applying for a Public Works Loan to partly finance the necessary work. You will find further information about this in a separate article in this magazine. The existing orange lamps are now outdated and can no longer be replaced or repaired, so we have no option other than to go for new lamps, which will also save in power use and reduce costs as well as environmental impact.

Our third major project this year is the renovation of the village's Pocket Park, located next to the Kingshill layby. The Parish Council has a programme of work that will take us into the New

Year. Members of the Parish Council have already cleared all the foliage and exposed a very attractive feature on the approach to the Pocket Park, namely Frillingford Bridge. You will also find an interesting article in this magazine by the Chairman of the Parish Council on the history of this bridge.

Work is now in progress to pollard and make safe the willow trees that line the banks of the stream - in order for this work to be carried out, the Pocket Park has had to be temporarily closed, but we anticipate that it will not be too long until we are able to open it up again. Members of the Council will then be planting some native species of bulbs, which we hope you will all be able to enjoy in the Spring. We also have new benches and tables that will be installed when the conditions are right.

A new Pocket Park Committee has been formed under the auspices of the Parish Council, and we will soon be asking members of the community to join us as Friends of the Pocket Park in order to carry our further renovations and to maintain the park in the future. If you are interested in becoming part of this project, please contact the Parish Clerk.

The village of Syresham also belongs to the Neighbourhood Watch Scheme the aim of which is to reduce crime by directly involving the community in activities that promote safety or assist with the detection of crime. The Parish Council is in the process of putting up new signs, as the old ones have become rather dated and in some cases dilapidated. Our Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator is Ruth at the Post Office, If you have any issues relating to Neighbourhood Watch, please contact Ruth.

DEADLINE FOR APPLICATIONS: 10.00 A.M., 24^{TH} NOVEMBER 2020.

To qualify, a person must be a UK or Commonwealth citizen, citizen of the Irish Republic or member state of the EU. In addition you must also have lived, worked or been registered in the parish of Syresham or lived within 3 miles of the boundary for the whole of the previous 12 months.

You are not allowed to stand as a candidate if:

- you already work for the parish council;
- are subject to bankruptcy restrictions;
- have within the last five years been sentenced to a prison term of three months.



STREETLIGHTING IN SYRESHAM IMPORTANT INFORMATION

At the Syresham Parish Council meeting of 14th 2020. October following unsuccessful bids for grant money, it was RESOLVED to seek the approval of the Secretary of State for Communities Housing, & Government to apply for a Public Works Loan Board loan of £13,000 over the borrowing term of 3 years for part funding of the upgrade of streetlighting in the parish. The annual loan repayments will come to around £4.483.

It is not intended to increase the council tax precept for the purpose of the loan repayments.

SYRESHAM FOOTPATHS - A SUGGESTED WALK - NOVEMBER 2020

Despite Covid restrictions we have walked as many footpaths as possible in and around Syresham Parish.

Our original map had an error on it and it so was taken down from the Post Office window. Most paths are walkable now that the growing and nesting season is over, although the AZ3, is under discussion with NCC because of the wet area near the sewage farm.

FRIENDS OF SYRESHAM SCHOOL

Although it's been of a bit of a peculiar start to the school year, with many of our traditional events unable to take place, we have actually been rather busy and a lot has happened since July! We've reassessed a lot of what we do and remain committed to finding new ways to raise funds and explore new ways to make lasting happy memories for the children at the school.

In September we were able to welcome new parents to the school with "First Day Survival Packs", rather than our usual welcome coffee afternoon. We also held our first ever virtual balloon race to kick start our fundraising on the first week back, with the children (and their parents) eagerly following virtual balloons across the skies of Russia to see whose balloon would travel the furthest!

Years 1 and 2 won the hotly contested inter-class competition and were rewarded with a new dressing up box, full of fabulous new costumes from Cleopatra to Armstrong and a brand new box of toy cars! With over 200 balloons entered into the race we raised an impressive £523 for School, which was then put to work straight away at our Autumn DIY and Tidy Up on the 17th October paying for new outdoor chalk boards, planters and various maintenance supplies. Thank you to everyone who was able to make

it—it was a fabulous team effort and there were a lot of aching limbs the next day, but as always we managed to get an amazing amount done in a very short period of time and the children (and teachers) alike were thrilled with the results!

We held our AGM in October via zoom, which whilst very different to our usual cheese and wine evening, was still a lovely opportunity to reflect on what has been achieved over the past 12 months and plan how the FOSS can support school in the coming year.

I am delighted to report that it has been yet another amazingly successful year for The Friends of Syresham School raising a substantial £5,614 which considering the abrupt end to all fundraising in March, is a fabulous result. Incredibly it was a record breaking year for spending with a phenomenal £12,870 going to school!! This included significant contributions to the outdoor areas, French lessons, the PHSE mental health programme, a new phonics programme and a whole plethora of special requests from individual classes; from Boom Boxes to Bug Hotels, a Storytelling Chair to a new woodwork bench and everything in hetween!

These achievements are in no small part down to all the wonderful ladies on the committee. I know it isn't always easy to give up your time and to juggle all the other stuff going on in your lives, but I think we can be thoroughly proud of what we have achieved in what has been a

particularly difficult year. As a small village school we very much rely on everyone pulling together for a shared purpose and a common goal, for the benefit of the children and I am very conscious that without everyone's ongoing support, FOSS just wouldn't be able to achieve all the things we do.

So a big thank you to everybody!

On top of our regular fundraising commitments to the school and the continuation of our "Class Wish List" scheme, Mrs Clough provided us with requests for future spending including "in-school experience days" together with a portable kitchen unit and to develop a new outdoor area for Years 3 and 4. So we have a lovely long shopping list of items to fund, and all that remains for us to do is deliver the money! (So if you fancy giving us a hand that would be marvellous!)

We said a sad but immensely grateful farewell to our former Chair, Sarah Eames. She has however assured us that she is still keen to remain on the committee... which is great news. I was then voted in as the new Chair which is both a daunting and exciting prospect as I follow in the footsteps of some pretty impressive ladies from the village!

I am delighted to be able to announce that our

first target has been reached. The trustees have been

amazed at the very enterprising ways in which people have, in spite of or maybe because of the Covid19 pandemic, managed to engage with others and continue to raise funds despite so many activities being currently not possible.

We have almost reached the magic figure of £165,000 which will ensure provision of a digital, state-of-the-art X -ray machine with fixed table, and discussions earlier this week with the Northamptonshire Healthcare Foundation Trust clarified that this equipment is now not going to cost quite as much. This means - more good news - that we already have adequate funds. This will ensure the provision of a Smart TV set in each room which will not only combat loneliness for the patients but will also enable consultations with specialists and family, all compatible with the NHS Pathway which will ensure total confidentiality. Importantly. televisions will be free at the point of use to the patients!

There is more that is needed to enhance the facilities for local

residents within the building. The first item on the list is the ultrasound scanner of which we have been aware since the

beginning. Next, we understand that cardiologists have expressed an interest in holding clinics at Brackley requiring equipment, so to benefit local residents who would then not need to

travel to other hospitals and who would thus also reduce their carbon footprint, that is added to our list. For the same reason and for different beneficiaries, equipment to enable ophthalmologists to come here rather than us all go to them is also being investigated.

Your continued support is therefore requested and required. If you can think of innovative ways to raise funds,

PROGRESS REPORT—HS2

Work on the HS2 project has been given the go ahead and local residents will have seen works starting. At present, current activity includes geological, ecological and archaeological studies and fencing off

the construction areas. The improved junction for Greatworth and Sulgrave on the B4525 has recently been completed in preparation for a works compound on the Sulgrave Road.

HS2 are aware of the condition of the B4525, and for this reason a temporary road will be built on the line of the route for construction traffic to use, to keep as many trucks as possible off the B4525. However, this will take a year to

complete. During construction of the

Greatworth tunnel the B4525 will be re-routed temporarily, and reinstated later, which should mean minimal disruption while travelling to and from M40/Banbury. A compound is being constructed on the A422 Buckingham Road between Westbury and Brackley, continuing until summer 2021.

There have been some early works on the A43 southbound between Whitfield and Bracklev involving overnight lane closures. It is likely to be two years before construction work on the A43 begins. There will be an inreconstruction of the line dual carriageway over the HS2 line. As the line is built, it will be necessary to shut one side of the carriageway and then the other. However, Highways England will ensure that there will be 4 lanes of traffic open (with speed restrictions). Radstone Road junction at A43 will be improved for lorry access point for the road built along the line of HS2 for construction traffic

Lorries should not come through Syresham, along Main Road, they will be instructed to join the A43 at the B4525 junction. However, the Parish Council will monitor the situation.

All footpaths between Syresham and Brackley will be dissected by the line. Some will need to be realigned to cross the tracks. There will be footpath closures, and it is not possible at the moment to say how long the closures will last for. Eventually all footpath connections will be reinstated via bridges/viaducts.

There have been several requests from residents for better local cycle-path

connections. Constructors have been asked if a cycle route to Brackley could be incorporated into planned A43 reconstruction. However, the remit of the works is to replace what is there like for like, so there is nothing in the budget for adding a cycle route to Syresham. NCC Highways have also informed the Parish Council there is not enough HS2 road safety funding available for a cycle-path from Crowfield to High Cross.

The project is very complex and there is not an exact date for completion of works, however the estimate is that there will be 4-5 years of civil engineering work and a further 3-4 years building the rail track/signalling etc. Commissioning is not expected until 2030-32.

It has not been possible for HS2/EKFB to hold public meetings, due to the pandemic. The intention is when possible, community information events will be held at HS2 new offices on Buckingham Road, Brackley. In the meantime, they will be publishing newsletters and holding online exhibitions and consultations.
