From the Editor's Desk

So here we are, almost another year over and done with! And we successfully managed the BST transition last weekend! Or did you miss it?

During the first world war, Germany and then the allies introduced daylight saving time as a way of saving energy, reasoning that increased light in the evening bluow reduce the consumption of energy. In 1916. Parliament passed the Summer Time Act, creating British Summer Time (BST). It was the result of a campaign started in 1907 by William Willett, to stop people wasting valuable hours of light in the summer and to save fuel during the war.

During the Second World War (1939-1945), British Double Summer Time two hours in advance of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) - was temporarily introduced for the period when ordinary daylight saving would be in force. During the winter, clocks were kept one hour in advance of GMT to increase productivity. In 1968-71, a three-year experiment was conducted with British Standard Time, keeping the clocks fixed throughout the year on GMT+1. But the dark winter mornings were unpopular, particularly in Scotland. In 1971. MPs voted to return to the system that continues.

During recent months the Parish Council has been working



without the services of a Parish Clerk. We are very pleased that we have been able to keep the wheels of the council turning and now anticipate our new clerk Mrs Nichola Ali, taking on the role early in November. We look forward to working with her.

At the same time we have also been working with eight instead of nine parish councillors. A new councillor, Mr Gary Lowther from Crowfield, has now been appointed. We welcome Gary and look forward to working with him in the future. However, we still have a vacancy for another councillor as Councillor Haycock will be moving away and has resigned. Jenny has been a very proactive member of the council for a number of years and we thank her for all the great work she has done on behalf of the council. We wish her well as she moves on.

The role of Parish Councillor is a very important one and can be both satisfying and rewarding. If you feel that this is something you might like to consider, please contact the new clerk parishclerk@syresham.com and she will be pleased to give you further information.

The Parish Council held a second Climate Change Fair in the village hall on September 22nd and we were very pleased that a reasonable number of village residents came along to speak

to the stallholders about a very important issue that affects us all. Stallholders included Swallows Nursery from Mixbury. Climate Action-West Northants (CA-WN), RSPB. Green Machine. ACRE. SNATRA. Anglian Water. Svresham Repair Shop. Towcester and Brackley Foodbanks. We also welcomed children from the school who produced a lovely poster display and also showed great interest in this important subject.

In the Summer the Parish Council made the considered decision to declare a Climate Emergency. As a consequence of this we have produced a Climate Action Plan that was on display at the Climate Change Fair and can now be found on the village website www.syreshamvillage.com

REPORT FROM WEST NORTHANTS COUNCILLOR, SILVERSTONE WARD, DERMOT BAMBRIDGE



There is not a great deal to report this month. I am starting with an issue related to dogs which you may have picked up from the recent WNC Parish Briefing but as there is

an item related to dogs on your PC agenda, I felt it was appropriate to highlight it.

NEW RULES FOR DOGS AND SMOKING.

West Northants Cabinet has introduced a variation to the Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPOS) which came into force on 3rd October to help promote responsible dog ownership and now prohibits smoking in certain public spaces across the whole of West Northamptonshire.

The requirements and restrictions of the variation to the Order are summarised as follows. Anyone who is in control of a dog in a public place must:

- pick up after the dog immediately;
- have the appropriate means to pick up after that dog;
- prohibit dogs from entering the following: children's play areas, schools when open and in use by pupils, skateparks, tennis courts, multiuse games areas (MUGAs) and bowling greens;

keep the dog on a lead when in:

Cemeteries, burial sites, graveyards, memorial gardens, allotments, car parks, sports grounds, fields and pitches, when in use for authorised sporting activity, land near the café area at Daventry Country Park, Northampton Town Centre, Land at Upton Country Park Phase 2 (land between Kislingbury and Upton) and near schools when open and in use by pupils

- put the dog on a lead when requested to do so by an Authorised Person;
- restrict the number of dogs that can be walked by one person to a maximum of four dogs at any one time, unless they are a licensed boarder, breeder or dog day care provider whereby a maximum of six can be walked at any one time.
- In addition, the smoking of tobacco, tobacco related products, smokeless tobacco products including electronic cigarettes, herbal cigarettes or any illegal substances is prohibited in the following areas:
- Children's play areas, in and near schools when open and in use by pupils; Skateparks; tennis courts;
- multi-use games areas (MUGAs) and bowling greens.

A £100 fixed penalty notice (FPN) may be issued if you fail to comply with any of the requirements or restrictions contained within the varied PSPOs.

PLANNING UPDATES

Nothing has happened on the

Syresham Truck Stop application since April. Planning Department still awaits the applicant submitting further highway information.

The AL employment sites are still in ongoing discussions with the respective highway authorities. DHL and Bell Plantation (both AL1) might be making further formal submissions in about three weeks. The committee dates are still unknown.

PARISH PATH WARDEN

This is a great time of year to enjoy walking in the countryside around Syresham,



whether you're out for a 20 minute stroll or a 2 hour yomp. As the nights draw in, there's even more reason to get out for some fresh air during daylight hours. For the next few weeks our fields and woodlands will continue to be transformed with a beautiful palette of red, orange, gold and yellow. The ground is likely to get boggy in places though, so don't forget your wellies or walking boots.

You can use the online map at https://bit.ly/45RDjmu to identify the footpaths, bridleways and byways around the parish; select the 'public rights of way' layer. Having this or an Ordnance Survey map on your phone, or a printed copy in your pocket, will help you keep on track.

If you find any issues when using our local rights of way (eg damaged stiles/ gates/footbridges, or overgrown/ impassable paths etc) please report them directly via www.fixmystreet.com (and ideally include a photo or two). You can do this from your phone while you're out, and wait till you get home. For problems with footpaths, bridleways and byways etc, go to the 'report your problem' page and select the 'right of way' category. If you also let me know, then I can track progress with the relevant authority and chivvy them along if necessary. remember, one of the best ways to keep a footpath clear is to keep using it!






